### 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Time of reckoning!

Fr Ephrem writes... In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us the parable of the talents. He symbolises the Kinadom of God with the different talents given to different men who had to give an account of their business to their master on his return. Each person was given talents according to his capacity, but he was required to produce with what he was given.

Similarly the Lord has given different gifts to each of us that we may use them and produce some results. The Lord does not expect us to produce the same amount or to use our talents in the same way. But no one is exempt from producing some kind of fruit.

Applying this parable in our lives, we can assert the following facts:

- 1. Each one of us is gifted with one or many gifts and talents.
- 2. All the aifts are given to build up the Body of Christ, the Church.
- 3. We have to use all our gifts and contribute to the life of the Church and the wider world.

But to do so, we have first to ask ourselves what talents we actually have. God gives us natural as well as supernatural gifts. We could be endowed with natural talents or spiritual gifts from the Lord. Once we discern our aifts the next step is to generously use them in the life of the Church and to make the world a better place to live in.

Sometimes we may not be able to see our own gifts! In this case, it would be wise to listen to what others say about our hidden gifts. Sometimes unforeseen circumstances may bring our talents to the fore. Once we discover our hidden talents, we should not bury them; instead, we have to develop them in every way we can so that we may use them to build up the Church. As far as we try our best to serve in every way we can, our talents will not remain hidden and eventually they will bear much fruit for the alory of God, the good of others and ourselves. Please always remember that you are talented!
