4th SUNDAY OF ADVENT - The POWER of LOVE!

And so our Advent journey is almost complete as today we light the 4th candle on our Advent wreath – the candle which represents love. In just a few days' time, on Christmas Eve, we will light the 5th & final candle – the white candle at the centre, symbolizing Jesus as the light of the world. That light came to blaze amongst us in a whole new way, unimaginable to previous generations, on that Bethlehem night when God was born as one of us as a tiny baby, born into poverty. God sent His Son, Jesus, to earth as the ultimate expression of His unconditional love, offering humanity hope, redemption and a path to eternal life, a gift freely given for all people, not just for a season but for every day and for all time. This divine love, demonstrated through Jesus' humble birth, calls us to reflect that same love through compassion, forgiveness, and kindness to others. This gift is not just for a season, to be taken down like Christmas decorations; it is for an eternal relationship with God, offering peace, joy and salvation.

Our Gospel for this Sunday focuses on Joseph – the quiet man of the Bible, who does not have a single spoken word recorded in the Gospels. He is a man whose actions speak louder than words – a 'man of honour' who fulfils the mission entrusted to him with deep humility, faith & courage. Joseph, like Mary, says "Yes" to God's plan, even though he risks losing his cherished good reputation as many will assume he is the father of Mary's child. We can learn so much from Joseph – his faithfulness, courage and humility - one who abandons himself totally to God's will, giving everything for Jesus. This is how we are also invited to respond to God's love.

We hope to see you for our parish Christmas celebrations this week. But for those of you who will be away from the parish this Christmas, please take our blessings with you: Wishing you and your family -

The blessing of peace, the beauty of hope, the spirit of love, and the comfort of faith. May these be your most precious gifts this Christmas!
